ZIPPY Wallpaper Steamer

Caution! Read before operating!

Burn Hazards! Hot Surfaces! Live Steam!

Use

1. Empty water from steamer.
2. Fill with one gallon of water. The water level should be 2" from the top. DO NOT overfill or it will overflow from vent tube.
3. Plug into 120 v 15 amp outlet.
4. Allow 20-30 minutes for steam. Using hot water to fill the reservoir will decrease the time needed to produce steam.
5. Place pan flat in paint pan while heating and when not in use. Cookie sheets work well also. DO NOT put pan(s) in porcelain sink or tub or steam may cause them to break.
6. Start at the top of the wall and work across and down. Hold the plate against the paper for 15-60 seconds depending on the type of paper. As you move the plate, overlap the area you just steamed. With a broad flat putty knife, scrape the paper from the wall being careful not to gouge the wallboard.
7. Make sure to cover your floor and have towels available. Steam will condense and run down the wall.
8. When the tank runs out of water, unplug the machine and wait a few minutes for it to cool. The cap will be hot so use gloves when removing. Refill and continue working.
9. Read safety instructions!
10. If steamer stops, check:
 - a. water level
 - b. kinks in hose
 - c. re-set button

Safety

1. To prevent burns, use caution in contacting steamer, hose, and pan.
2. Connect hose and pan before connecting electricity.
3. Do not make or break hose connections with steamer.
4. Do not remove fill cap with steamer operating or when steam is flowing.
5. Do not direct steam from pan towards anyone.
6. Do not allow children in the vicinity of this equipment when hot or steaming.
7. Drain tank before and after using. Dirty water or additives will make the tank boil over violently.
